Darlene Newell, a retired nurse and nursing home administrator, is a NGC Master Flower Show Judge, Horticulture, Flower Show Procedure, and Symposium Instructor and Daffodil Judge. She has lectured in twenty-two states. She is a life member of WVGC and NGC and a member of the American Horticulture, Hosta, and Daffodil Societies. She serves on the NGC Board of Directors as the Horticulture Chairman and on the state level as the WV Flower Show Chairman.
