Important Dates:

Container Grown Plants in the Horticulture Division must be in the possession of the exhibitor no later than January 1, 2022 (Sections A – M)
Cuttings in the Arboreal Sections must be in the possession of the exhibitor for at least six months before the Flower Show (Sections R – U)
Plants used in Combination Entries (Sections K 51 – 52) must be grown together for six weeks before the Flower Show
Horticulture container grown entries MUST be entered on Thursday, March 30th from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Cut speciments may be entered on Thursday, March 30th from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. OR
Friday, April 1st from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m.
Design and Educational Exhibits may be assembled on Thursday, March 30th from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and completed on on Friday, April 1st from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m.

USDA Plant Hardiness Zones: What Does it All Mean?

Most of our neighborhoods in Broward County are in Zone 10 according to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Zones are identified by the USDA to help growers know what plants and trees can best tolerate a particular climate. Zones are divided by 10 degree changes in average winter temperatures. There are eleven zones in the United States. Zone 1 has the coldest winters and Zone 11 with the warmest winters. Zone 10 is characterized by mild frost-free winters and long summers. Verify your zone by entering your ZIP Code at https://planthardiness.ars.usda.gov

Plants recommended for Zone 10 can survive a low temperature of between 30-40 degrees F. This temperature range marks the coldest temperatures expected on average in South Florida. It doesn't mean a gardener cannot try growing plants recommended for other zones, but the growth and blooming may not be as hardy as anticipated. Many plants being sold at local nurseries and home improvement centers list the zone that is appropriate for that plant, so check out the tag before buying that beautful blooming plant.

Obviously, success at growing a specific plant depends on more than just winter temperature (things like soil, sunshine, water, etc.), but using plants from the appropriate zone is a good starting point for having a successful garden. Native plants, by their very nature, are most appropriate for any particular USDA zone. But even native plants should be planted in their appropriate ecological habitat. Plants native to the sand dunes of Fort Lauderdale Beach may not be the best plant for a garden near the Everglades.
